Township of Bates November 6th A.D. 1894

The General Election of Bates Township County of Iron and State of Michigan was held at Schoolhouse no. 1 in Bates Township on Tuesday being the 6th day of November A.D. 1894

After the Inspectors was assembled they proceeded to appoint a assistant Clerk A motion was made by Frank Erickson supported by John E. Gronlund to appoint Olaf Anderson to assistant Clerk of this Election which motion was unanmiously carried An motion was made by Adalp Forsberg supported by Ole Benson to appoint Peter G Johnson to Gatekeeper of this Election which motion was unanmiously carried The Inspectors then consisted of the following named persons viz: Frank Erickson Chairman John E. Gronlund and Ole Benson Inspectors Adalp Forsberg Clerk Olaf Anderson Assistant Clerk After the above named persons having taken the Constitutional oath of office the Polls was then opened and continued open untill five o'clock in in the afternoon with the exception from Twelve to one o'clock at noon at which time the board adjourned for one hour after having sealed the Ballot Boxes as required by law After closing the polls the votes was publicly counted by the board of Inspectors and the result was read by Adalp Forsberg Clerk of said Election to the persons there assembled and drew up the following statement
