COUNTY COMMISSIONERS REPORT — Comm Stafford stated the new County Board had their first meeting on January 12th. They passed a resolution stating that they stand in unison with small businesses. They believe the recent COVID restrictions have been unconstitutional and an attack on civil liberties. He understands that the Sheriff's Dept and the Prosecutor's office have no desire to enforce these rules. However, the Health Dept does have the power to fine and close businesses. / Golas asked if the County Commissioners have authority to get vaccines to the area quicker? / Stafford indicated "no."

Oberlin stated that the resident is putting in a storm wall to prevent erosion. He stated that shoreline protection measures are under the EGLE jurisdiction. Golas stated that the shoreline has been cleared. He would like to see the Zoning Administrator do more to educate about the shorelines. BUDGET WORKSHOP

<u>Utility Rates</u> – The Board discussed a potential Water/Sewer rate increase. USDA in the past has recommend rate increases. Water rates were last increased in 2007 and the current sewer rate dates back into the 1990s. The Residents that were present suggested that the rates should be increased to support infrastructure improvements.

UTILITY RATES

<u>EGLE Seminar</u> — Oberlin stated that there was a meeting at the Bates Hall of 6 municipalities sponsored by EGLE. There is a grant available for a feasibility study. The grants available are up to \$500,000. The study is to determine is combining water systems is feasible. The City of Iron River will be the grant applicant and GEI will write the grant. A motion was made by Oberlin to contribute \$500 as the Township's match. Supported by Franzene. Roll call vote: Adams, yes; Nelson, yes; Benson-Stafford, yes; Franzene, yes; Oberlin, yes. Unanimous. Motion carried. PW Benson stated that there are pros/cons to combining systems, but the study should provide good information.
